Current Running Project of Organization

- RAH are aware the Maternal and Child Health, under the program Health Awareness programme in Bokaro District, which was undertaken by **District Rural Health Society, Bokaro.**
- **DRDA**, **Dhanbad** are allotted the Mini ITI training under Livelihood Project in Nirsa Block for SHGs and BPL.
- RAH has aware the Maternal and Child Health, under the program Health Awareness programme in Hazaribag District which was undertaken by **District Rural** Health Society, Hazaribag.

Health :-

Family Planning Awareness Programme :

As an effort to complement **District Rural Health Society**, **Bokaro** initiatives to promote Family health and planning services to the marginalized segment of the society. Street play (Nukkad – Nattak) were conducted in important male congregation points and other public locations in the program areas. Street play are an excellent medium to expose the target group to key messages in a simple and entertaining manner. These Nukkad – Nattak work conducted from 11 to 17 July 2010 under Health fare week. They were motivated for family planning.

Medicine Distribution:

Rah and Maleria control Department, Bokaro in a joint effort under **National Vector Borne Disease Control Programme (NVBDCP)** under line population under MDA about 2500 people, were distributed medicine (D.E.C and Albendazole) form 5 September to 9 September 2010

Interruption of transmission of filariasis by Annual MDA:

- Children below 2 years
- Pregnant Women
- Seriously ill Persons

AIDS Awareness Programme

RAH has organized one day HIV / AIDS awareness camp held on 1st December 2010 at Khairachattar. This program 150 youth and women are participated in awareness programe. This program focused on the youth and women people. Awareness was spread about the cause & precautions among the rural & illiterate people about AIDS/HIV. RAH has focused on reduction of stigma & discrimination, promotion of services viz, counseling & testing , ART, reutilization of condom use and blood safety, special emphasis has been given to youth and women who are more vulnerable to the HIV infection.

Maternal and Child Health Awareness Programme:

RAH has aware the Maternal and Child Health , under the program Health Awareness programme in Dhanbad Area which was undertaken by **District Rural Health Society**, **Dhanbad**. Through this campaign we intend to provide information regarding Maternal and Child health and other health related issues of All Blocks in Dhanbad, Jharkhand. The key components of the campaign was well equipped by IEC Van with Nukkd – Nattak and chou Troupes, etc to raising awareness among Mother, Father, Family, women, youth, panchyat members, tribal & tribal leaders and Rural people, etc. The IEC Van campaign was also consisted of Nukkad Natak teams and Chou cultural troupes. Troupes explained through Nukkad – Nattak and chou that simple health interventions, including vaccinations, would reduce the children's illnesses. And, we educate them about the importance of regular antenatal care and other preventative measures to improve family health.

Skill Development Program

RAH carried out programmes for skill development to empower all individuals through improved skills, knowledge, recognized qualifications to gain access to decent employment and ensure competitiveness in the market.

Most of villager's members are belonging to farming communities. If they avail micro credit, they use the amount for Agriculture and allied activities that yield meager income sometimes and many times no income at all. So, we planned ten days Tailoring program held at khairachattar on 15 November 2010, in these training program 20 poor women are participated, for employment oriented training programme to our rural women and thereby started tailoring training centre in the village as a first step going towards making the women to involve in diversified activities to earn the income reasonably

The objective was to enhance individual's employability and ability to adapt to changing technologies and labour market demand.
